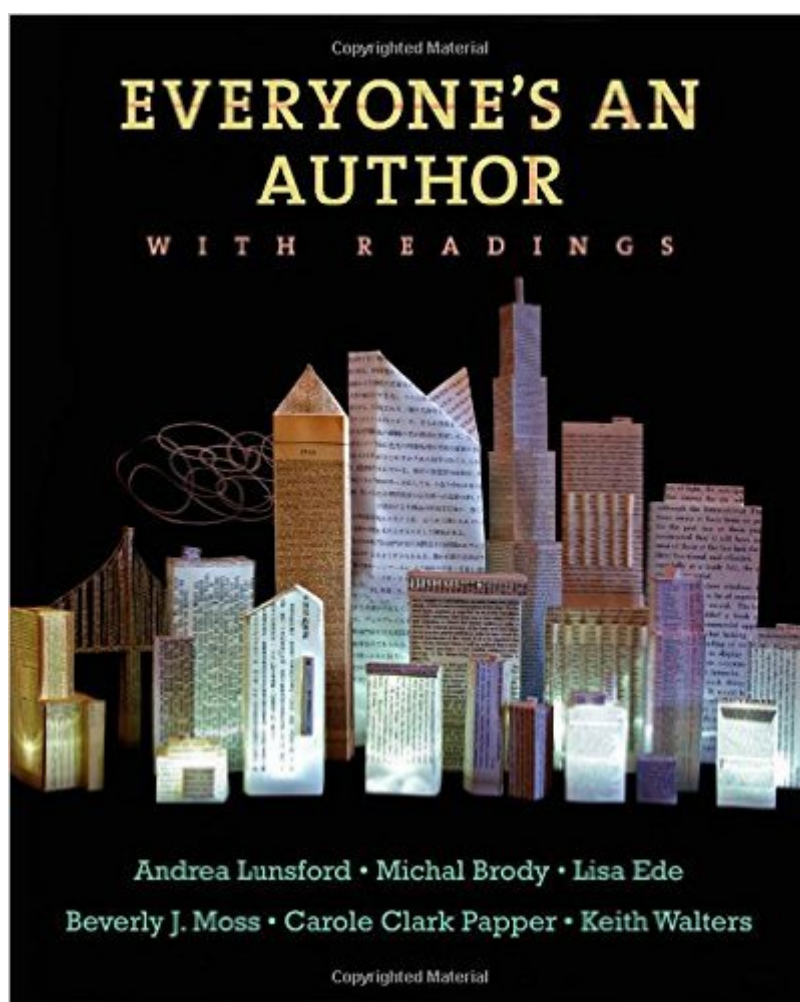

This textbook is full of the most rank bias and propaganda I have yet encountered in school.
