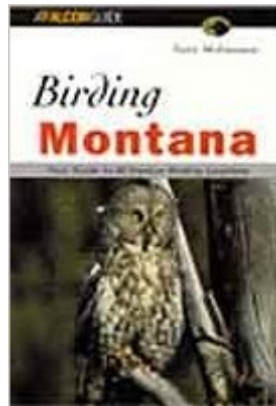

Bird-finding guides can really help point visitors to good places, but this one is a bit weak. Montana is a huge state, of course, so inevitably this book just selects a handful of spots, but even these aren't described in enough detail to have helped me find all the birds I wanted to see. It's 20 years old now, a revision is way overdue. Certainly better than nothing, but a visiting birder would find

more birds and more top birding sites by digging through e-bird records.

This is a great book for the basics. It tells you where to see birds with a brief list of possible sightings. Since it covers such a large area, it's just perfect for my needs. If I want to know more about a specific spot, I can research more online. I have already explored several hot spots and not been disappointed.
